A Memorable Event

The 2008 Cardinal Wright Awards Dinner was indeed, a memorable event. The evening began with the annual Vocations Mass concelebrated by Cardinal Dan DiNardo, Bishop David Zubik and fellow alumni priests and faculty! Bishop welcomed Cardinal Zubik Daniel DiNardo back to the diocese in his first official visit since his elevation to the

office by Pope Benedict XVI. The readings could not have been more appropriate! Cardinal DiNardo noted in his homily that the transfer of leadership in the Old Testament probably barely made the local news. The reading was only selected because of the Sunday's gospel readings with Peter's acknowledgement of Jesus as "the Christ, the Son of the living God'. Cardinal DiNardo noted that it was not mere "flesh and blood" that revealed this to Peter but God the Father. It was all grace. He reminded us that as Bishop's Latin School students, we were reminded in our high school years often and regularly that we were mere "flesh and blood" but were challenged to recognize a deeper reality. We were created in the image and likeness of God and were called to do all for God's greater glory. Our experience taught us that this was purely result of grace. Cardinal DiNardo recounted the events in his life which were not merely the result of "flesh and blood" but the result of grace. Closing his homily in humility, he quoted the lines of the second reading.

Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How inscrutable are his judgments and how unsearchable his ways! For who has known the mind of the Lord or who has been his counselor? Or who has given the Lord anything that he may be repaid? For from him and through him and for him are all things. To him be glory forever. Amen. The dinner was preceded by a photo shoot of individual pictures with the cardinal and the bishop for a



suggested offering, half of which was given to each as a sign of appreciation. Approximately, 78 individuals attended the dinner, including Msgr. Ed Burns, newly assigned Vocations Director for the diocese. The event was emceed by Raymond Niedenberger, Class of '67. The awardees, Mr. Robert Irr, Fr. Albert Semler and Fr. Joe Koterski SJ were very gracious in the receipt of their awards (backgrounds on the website). Cardinal Dan DiNardo received a gift certificate for a crosier as a sign of appreciation which will remain in the diocese. As Fr. Lou Vallone, who introduced the cardinal, noted, "Cardinal DiNardo will always belong to Pittsburgh and the Bishop's Latin School". A new award was inaugurated, the Rev. Joseph E. Henry SJ award, and given to Gary Gayda (and his wife, Sue) for his commitment to the BLS Alumni Association. The classes of 1973 and 1965 were recognized in a special way. The CD of the Month Club fundraiser was announced. The evening began with an invocation by Fr. Joe Henry SJ and concluded with

benediction by Fr. William McGrath, two instructors who were with the Latin School at the beginning. In his benediction, Fr. William McGrath SJ told the story of an older woman whom he asked to pray that the Bishop's Latin School would not close. After the woman died, the school did close. However, Fr. McGrath noted the closing of the physical doors of a building did not mean finality. The spirit of the School is alive in those who have gone on before us, those present Sunday evening, and in all involved with the BLS Alumni Association. The evening was capped by a photo of all alumni in attendance.
