WILLIAM J. GLUNK TO BE ORDAINED

In ceremonies scheduled for July 21 at St. Paul Cathedral, Bill Glunk, '65, will become the sixth Latin School alumnus ordained to the priesthood. The 12:30 afternoon ordination will be presided over by Bishop Vincent M. Leonard. A parish Mass of Thanksgiving will be celebrated on Sunday, July 22, at 2:30, in St. Ursula Church, Allison Park, with a reception to follow.

Bill will also be the first BLS graduate to complete theological studies at North American College in Rome, where he has been for the past four years. He arrives home during the first week of July to prepare for the occasion.

The five members of the alumni ordained on May 5 began their parish duties on May 22. Fr. John Sweeney was assigned to Our Lady of Lourdes in Burgettstown, Fr. Paul Schratz, to St. Sylvester, Brentwood, Fr. Lou Vallone, to St. Joseph, Verona, Fr. Bob Obringer, to St. Paul Cathedral, and Fr. Dave Schorr to Nativity on the North Side.

The new priests joined in a special Mass at BLS for the student body during the week after ordination, with Fr. William J. Walsh, S.J., first Latin School headmaster, as one of the concelebrants. More recently, Frs. Vallone and Schratz concelebrated a Mass preceding the alumni re-union on June 15.

AVE ATQUE VALE

The final BLS graduation was held in St. Casimir Church on Sunday afternoon, June 3, with Bishop Leonard awarding the diplomas, and Fr. James L. Conner, S.J., Provincial of the Maryland Province of the Society of Jesus, addressing the graduates. The commencement added twenty members to the alumni association. This group, along with the classes of '74 and '75, swells the alumni ranks to a total of 259 members.
