"YOU ARE A PRIEST FOREVER..."

Dreams do come true. For Fr. Vince Marino '65, Fr. Gerry Mikonis, Fr. Dave Dzermejko, Fr. Stan Janiak and Fr. Jim McNiff, all of the class of '66, the dream of the priesthood became a reality with their ordination on May 4.

The five alumni were among the 21 new diocesan priests ordeined by Bishop Vincent Leonard in Pittsburgh's St. Paul's

Cathedray.

Another alumnus, Fr. Terry Fedigan '66 will be ordained in

Rome this summer after studying at North American College there.

Echoing Christ's command to His apostles to spread His Word to all men, Bishop Leonard told the new priests in his homily, "to serve the Church of Christ, particularly to serve, to carry the words of salvation to your fellow men."

On May 30, the five men started their first assignments as assistants in parishes around the diocese.

Fr. Vince Merino is now at St. George's in Allentown. He studied at Duquesne and later at North American College and the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome. Last year, he worked at St. Canice in knoxville and taught religion pert-time at Hilltop Catholic High School.

He said that his Latin School training is still evident in his "work habits, love of education...and general approach to life. It opened me up to a lot of things...peoplewise." He added, "I'll always be grateful for that."

Blessed Sacrament Parish in Natrona Heights is the new home of Fr. Dave Dzermejko. Dave studied at the Athenaeum of Ohio, St. Gregory's Sem in Cincinnati and St. Vincent's in Latrobe before working as a deacon this past year at St. Bonaventure's in Glenshaw.

Fr. Stan Janiak was assigned to St. Teresa's in Perrysville. After commuting to BLS from the South Side for four years, Stan attended Duquesne, Indiana University in Bloomington, Ind., and St. Meinrad's for theology. Last year he worked with the people (continued)

of St. Elizabeth's in Pleasant Hills.

After a year as a deacon at St. Paul's Cathedral, Fr. Jim McNiff was sent to St. Wendelin's in Carrick. He studied at Duquesne and St. Francis in Loretto.

Now that the goal of the Latin School—to train men for the priesthood—has become a reality in the last two years, its success can be measured by the apostolic work of ordained BLS graduates.

Fr. Jim McNiff said it will emphasize "that the Latin School in its founding idea was an excellent idea."

Two former BLS faculty members, Fr. Francis Reese and Fr. Joseph Henry, were among those attending the ordination.

They watched as the bishop imposed his hands on the heads of each of the deacons and prayed. And they saw the dreams of each of the new priests fulfilled.

Deacons' Ordained and Assigned

Five members of the class of '67 were recently ordained to the diaconate, the last major step on their way to the priest-hood.

On May 9, Bill Ogrodowski and Dave Carey became deacons in ceremonies at North American College in Rome, where they have been studying.

At St. Peter's Church on the North Side, Jim Bedillion, Dave Jastrab and Gilbert Puznakoski were among the 14 diocesan deacons ordained by Auxiliary Bishop Anthony Bosco on May 25.

From Pontifical College of Josephinum in Worthington, Ohio, Jim will do parish work at Our Lady of Fatima in Aliquippa this summer.

Dave was assigned to St. Mary of the Mount parish on Mt. Washington until he returns to St. Francis, Loretto this fall.

St. Anselm's parish in Swissvale has Gilbert, from St. Meinrad's Seminary in Indiana.

They will begin their last year of theological studies in the fall.
