Next meeting of the Board of Governors: November 3, 1974 at the Cathedral.

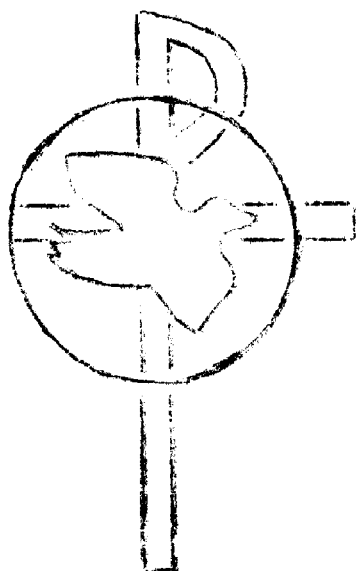

Dear Fellow Alumnus:


